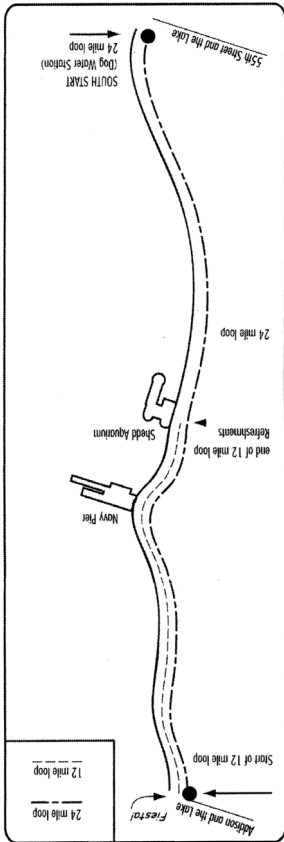

Chicago-Cinquera Sister Cities, formed in 1992 after the Salvadoran civil war ended, is a community to community based solidarity group. Chicago-Cinquera is partners with the small town of Cinquera through their community organization, ARDM. With their guidance, Chicago-Cinquera decides how best to assist them with some of their projects. In the past, Chicago-Cinquera helped to provide some of the funds for the ARDM staff, the ecotourism park, history documentation, advocacy projects & the youth group. The next projects will concentrate on leadership training with an emphasis on women's participation & grassroots organizing of the community in order to pursue positive economic changes for the majority of the people. CHICAGO-GUATEMALA PARTNERSHIP

Saq Ja', one of 440 villages destroyed by the Guatemalan Army during the 80's, continues its rebuilding process with the support of friends in Chicago. Educating their children so they can "give back" to strengthen their community's development & Mayan traditions, is an on-going priority. *Pedal for Peace* funded scholarships for students in the local *Instituto Basico* (middle-school) & especially for higher education available only outside the community, are crucial for the subsistence farmer families in Saq Ja'. *Pedal for Peace* funds may also be used to expand the agricultural production project, enabling families to grow crops that bring higher prices at the local markets. *Contact: Mary Naftzger (773)373-7805 (English) maryand-bob.n@sbcglobal.net or Virgilio Vicente (773)493-6114 (Spanish, K'iche)*
