Program Content

The content of our program is centered on five stages in the cycle of migration. At each stage of the cycle learners will have the option of exploring scripture relevant to their tradition, hearing testimony from recent immigrants and learning from each other in discussion.

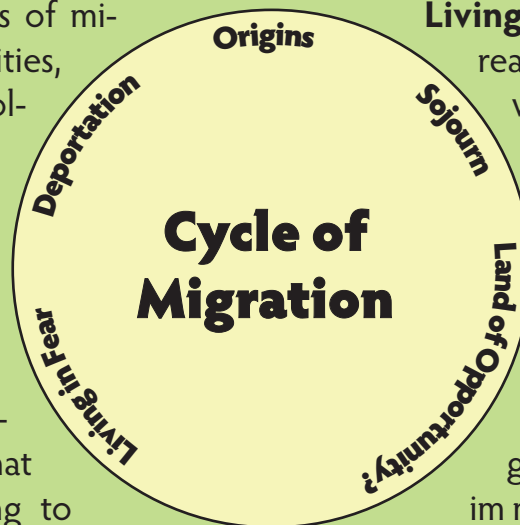
Origins - explore the roots of migration in sending communities, globalization, U.S. foreign policy

Sojourn - learn about the journey to the United states, and the trials of entering the country and border enforcement

Land of Opportunity? - learn about the realities that immigrants face in adapting to life in a land foreign to them and the positive contribution they make to the US

Living in Fear - explore the harsh reality that undocumented workers face without protection from employers who would take advantage of them and in the enforcement of immigration policies

Deportation - the last stage of the cycle of immigration where undocumented immigrants are faced with a legal system devoid of due legal process and separation from family is to be expected



Responding in Service - Religious communities will spend time in discernment of what has impacted them most and decide how they will be involved in the future
